Chapter 5

(1) And I saw in the right hand of him that sat on the throne a book written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.

(2) And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, Who is worthy to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof?

(3) And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, neither to look thereon.

(4) And I wept much, because no man was found worthy to open and to read the book, neither to look thereon.

(5) And one of the elders saith unto me, Weep not: behold, the Lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David, hath prevailed to open the book, and to loose the seven seals thereof.

(6) And I beheld, and, lo, in the midst of the throne and of the four beasts, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as it had been slain, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God sent forth into all the earth.

(7) And he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat upon the throne.

(8) And when he had taken the book, the four beasts and four *and* twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every one of them harps, and golden vials full of odours, which are the prayers of saints.

(1) And I saw in the right hand of Him Who sat on the throne a book^a written inside and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.

(2) And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, **Who is worthy to open the book, and to loose its seals?**

(3) And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, nor to look upon it.

(4) And I wept much, because no man was found worthy to open and to read the book, neither to look upon it.

(5) And one of the elders said to me, Do not weep: look, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has prevailed to open the book, and to loose its seven seals.

(6) And I looked, and, in the midst of the throne and of the four beasts, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as it had been killed, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God^b sent forth into all the earth.

(7) And He came and took the book out of the right hand of Him Who sat upon the throne.

(8) And when He had taken the book, the four beasts and twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each one of them having harps, and golden vials full of aromas, which are the prayers of saints.
