{23} Isaiah

King James Version

- (10) The LORD hath made bare his holy arm in the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.
- (11) Depart ye, depart ye, go ye out from thence, touch no unclean *thing*; go ye out of the midst of her; be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the LORD.
- (12) For ye shall not go out with haste, nor go by flight: for the LORD will go before you; and the God of Israel *will be* your rereward.
- (13) Behold, my servant shall deal prudently, he shall be exalted and extolled, and be very high.
- (14) As many were astonied at thee; his visage was so marred more than any man, and his form more than the sons of men:

- (5) For thy Maker *is* thine husband; the LORD of hosts *is* his name; and thy Redeemer the Holy One of Israel; The God of the whole earth shall he be called.
- (6) For the LORD hath called thee as a woman forsaken and grieved in spirit, and a wife of youth, when thou wast refused, saith thy God.

- (3) Because you will break forth on the right hand and on the left; and your descendants will inherit the Gentiles {nations; non-Jews}, and cause the desolate cities to be lived in.
- (4) Do not be afraid; because you will not be ashamed: nor be confounded; because you will not be put to shame: because you will forget the shame of your youth, and will not remember the reproach of your widowhood any more.
- (5) Because your Maker *is* your husband; the LORD {Jehovah} of hosts {armies; multitudes} *is* His Name; and your Redeemer the Holy One of Israel; He will be called the God of the whole earth.
- (6) Because the LORD {Jehovah} has called you as a woman forsaken and grieved in spirit, and a wife of youth, when you were refused, says your God.
- (7) For a small moment I have forsaken you; but with great mercies I will gather you.
- (8) In a little anger I hid My face from you for a moment; but with everlasting kindness I will have mercy on you, says the LORD {Jehovah} your Redeemer.
- (9) Because this *is* as the waters of Noah to Me: because as I have sworn that the waters of Noah should no more cover the earth; a so I have sworn that I would not be angry with you, nor rebuke you.
