Session 6: Oct. 10, 2021 Philippians 4:10-20 Joy and Contentment

(10) But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly, that now at the last your care for me has flourished again; in which you were also careful, but you lacked opportunity.

(11) Not that I speak in respect of want: because I have learned, in whatever state I am, to be content.

(12) I know both how to be brought low, and I know how to be lifted up: everywhere and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to have plenty and to suffer need.

(13) I can do all things through Christ Who strengthens me.

(14) Nevertheless you have done well, that you did communicate with my affliction.

(15) Now you Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but you only.

(16) Because even in Thessalonica you sent once and again to my needs.

(17) Not because I desire a gift: but I desire fruit that may abound to your account.

(18) But I have all, and abound: I am full, having received of Epaphroditus<sup>a</sup> the things *which were sent* from you, an aroma of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, well pleasing to God. (19) But my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

(20) Now to God and our Father *be* glory for ever and ever. Amen {let it be}. <<<<<<<

(21) Salute every saint in Christ Jesus. The brothers who are with me greet you.

(22) All the saints salute you, chiefly those who are of Caesar's household.
