{52} I Thessalonians

Chapter 2

- (1) Because you yourselves know, brothers, our coming to you, was not in vain:
- (2) But even after we had suffered before, and were shamefully treated, as you know, at Philippi,^a we were bold in our God to speak to you the gospel of God even amid much controversy.
- (3) Because our encouragement *was* not of deceit, nor of uncleanness, nor in trickery:
- (4) But as we were allowed by God to be put in trust with the gospel, even so we speak; not as pleasing men, but God, Who tries our hearts.
- (5) Because never at any time did we use flattering words, as you know, nor a cloak of covetousness {greed}; God *is* witness:
- (6) Nor did we seek praise of men, neither of you, nor *yet* of others, when we might have been a burden to you, as the apostles of Christ.

- (7) But we were gentle among you, even as a nurse cherishes her children:
- (8) So affectionately desiring you, we were willing to have imparted to you, not the gospel of God only, but also our very own souls, because you were dear to us.
- (9) Because you remember, brothers, our labor and pain: we preached to you the gospel of God laboring night and day, because we did not want to be indebted to any of you.
- (10) You *are* witnesses, and God *also*, how holy and justly and blamelessly we behaved ourselves among you who believe:
- (11) As you know how we encouraged and comforted and charged every one of you, as a father *does* his children,
- (12) That you would walk worthy of God, Who has called you to His kingdom and glory.
